The Daily Schedule

GOAL STATEMENT- MCAEOC will strive for excellence by enhancing educational services to support school readiness of children that will maximize their potential to enter kindergarten with a solid foundation for reading success

POLICY:

MCAEOC programs will utilize a daily schedule that will provide consistency in a balanced program of child initiated and adult-directed activities, including individual and small group activities, routines and transitions. The daily schedule meets the needs of all the children and the schedule is flexible.

PROCEDURE:

- 1. The Daily Schedule provides:
 - 1. Upon Arrival:
 - Teachers will greet children
 - Children will wash hands
 - Teachers will conduct a Daily Health Check
 - 2. Alternating periods of quiet and active play
 - 3. Schedule outdoor play daily, if weather permits
 - At a minimum outdoor play will be 60 minutes (morning and afternoon)
 - Children will go outside daily unless the weather is extreme (below 25 degrees F, pouring down rain, above 100 degrees with no covered area to play in)
 - 4. A balance of large muscle and small muscle activity
 - 5. More than one option available for group activities (individual, small/large group)
 - 6. 85 to 95 minutes each day will be scheduled for child-initiated activities (e.g., free choice, discovery time)
 - 7. Planned or routine activities may be changed according to the needs or interests of children, and/or to cope with changes in weather or other emergent situations that affect routines. Change in routine will be discussed with children to minimize anxiety.
 - 8. Fields trips can be schedule to provide hands on learning experiences that will extend classroom learning (Preschool classrooms)
 - 9. Set aside 30 minutes each day for each meal
 - Time between breakfast and lunch is at least 2.5 hours; between lunch and snack is at least 1.5 hours
 - 10. Adequate time for smooth transitions between activities
 - Use transition as a vehicle for learning (Mighty Minutes, Learning Games, Transition Songs)
 - 11. Incorporate routine tasks into the program as a means of furthering children's learning, self-help, and social skills. Routines such as toileting, eating, dressing,

hand washing, tooth brushing should be relaxed, reassuring, and individualized based on developmental needs

- Brushing teeth will be on the daily schedule
 - Brushing will be done twice daily
- Washing hands will be on the schedule
 - Handwashing will be done throughout the day (arrival, before and after meals and snacks, after toileting, before and after water and sand play, and after outdoor play
- Diapering should be check and changed regular
- Infants and Toddlers are feed on demand
- Infants and Toddlers sleep on demand
- 12. Prepare for departures:
 - Make sure children are ready to go home (check each child to ensure they are clean and dry
 - After all children have departure staff should prepare their classroom for the next day
- 13. The daily schedule will be posted in each classroom that is visible to adults and near the entrance to the classroom
- 14. A pictorial schedule will be posted in each classroom for the children at child's eye level
